



OBITUARY.

FRANK G. ROHNER, organist of the Church of Our Lady of Sorrows, died yesterday from a stroke of paralysis. He was born in Buffalo, N. Y., and was 64 years of age. He was engaged as organist and choir director of the Holy Family Jesuit church at the age of 18 and continued in that position for over twenty-five years. He later was organist of the Holy Name cathedral, the cathedral in San Francisco, and in Dubuque, Ia. The funeral will be from Our Lady of Sorrows church tomorrow morning. Burial will be at Detroit.

JOHN KELLER HANES, 57 years old, died suddenly Friday evening of heart trouble at his rooms, 1257 Dearborn avenue. Mr. Hanes was an old time newspaper man, having been at one time connected with the Philadelphia Ledger and later Chicago editor of the Iron Age. He recently retired from the coal business. A sister is the wife of H. C. Long of Pittsburg, superintendent of the western division of the Pennsylvania railroad. Mr. and Mrs. Long will take the body to Pittsburg this morning.

MRS. LENA F. LOSER, 53 years old, 4239 Grand boulevard, died yesterday after an illness of several months. She had been living in Chicago only about a year. Prior to that time she lived in Nashua, Iowa, where her husband, the late Lipman Loser, was a banker. She was a sister of Max Friend, Dr. Emmanuel Friend, Nathan Friend, Alexander Friend and S. Berman Friend, of Chicago, and of Mrs. J. Hacht of Charles City, Iowa. The funeral will be held tomorrow from the late residence.

THE REV. GEORGE C. ADAMS, for many years pastor of the Congregational church in San Francisco and one of the best known pulpit orators in the United States, died yesterday after an attack of apoplexy at his summer home in Mill Valley, Cal. He was born in Castine, Me., sixty years ago. He formerly lived in Boston and St. Louis.
