FRANK G. ROHNER, organist of the Church of Our Lady of Sorrows, died yesterday from a stroke of paralysis. He was born in Buffalo, N. Y., and was 64 years of age. He was engaged as organist and choir director of the Holy Family Jesuit church at the age of 18 and continued in that position for over twenty-five years. MRS. LENA F. LOSER, 53 years old, 4259 Grand houlevard, died yesterday after an illness of several months. She had been living in Chicago only about a year. Prior to that time she lived in Nashua, Iowa, where her husband, the late Lipman Loser, was a banker. She was a sister of Max Friend, Dr. Emmanuel Friend, Nathan Friend, Alexander Friend and S. Berman Friend, of Chicago, and of Mrs. J. Hecht of Charles City, Iowa. The funeral will be held tomoratow from the late residence.

THE REV. GEORGE C. ADAMS, for many years pastor of the Congregational church in San Francisco and one of the best known pulpit orators in the United States, died yesterday after an attack of apoplexy at his summer home in Mili Valley, Cal. He was born in Castine, Me., sixty years ago. He formerly lived in Boston and St. Louis.

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
