Saecula praeerita in saecula ventura

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age of twenty-eight years was caused by his being struck by a limb falling from a tree, 16 Dec. 1807. His headstone bears the Masonic emblem of the square and compasses.

He married at Amherst, Mass., about 1801, PRUDENCE FULLER, born there 14 Jan. 1775, daughter of Simeon and Mary (Harwood) Fuller; she married secondly, JOSHUA DICKINSON, and she died in Detroit, Mich., 20 Oct. 1856.

352. WILLIAM⁸ STONE (*John⁷ (180), Capt. Daniel⁶, Lieut. Micah⁵, Daniel⁴, Dea. Daniel³, Elder John², Dea. Gregory¹*), born in East Sudbury (now Wayland), Mass., 13 May 1787, for many years was a successful tavern keeper in Wayland, Stow, and Sudbury, Mass. Having acquired a competency he retired from this business, and in his later years engaged in farming in Sudbury where he died 10 Mar. 1862.

He married SUKEY CUTTER, born in Sudbury, 6 Feb. 1783, daughter of Joseph and Prudence (Thompson) Cutter; she died in Sudbury, 26 Dec. 1870.

353. WALTER H.⁸ STONE (*John⁷ (180), Capt. Daniel⁶, Lieut. Micah⁵, Daniel⁴, Dea. Daniel³, Elder John², Dea. Gregory¹*), born in East Sudbury (now Wayland), Mass., 8 May 1792, was a farmer in Sudbury and after 1835 in Framingham, Mass., and he died in Framingham, 9 Nov. 1853.

He married at Wayland, 8 June 1815, JANE MERRIAM, born there 5 June 1794, daughter of Elisha and Jane (Maynard) Merriam; she died in Framingham, 20 Aug. 1885.

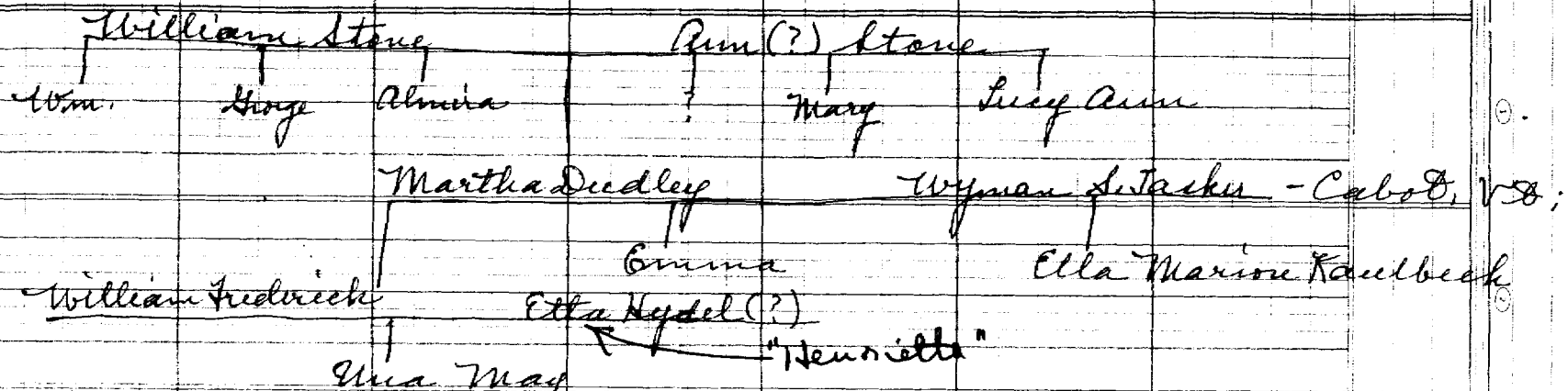

William Frederick, born Feb. 16, 1856 - place should be in genealogy but if not, he may have been born either in Marlboro Mass. or South Sudbury Mass. His father enlisted in the Army in the Civil War & I believe his regiment was from Marlboro, Mass. Massachusetts Civil War records are quite complete, so the Illinois State Library could probably verify this. If not, an inquiry through your Congressman, to the Library of Congress, will very likely get you the information.

The Simon Stone Genealogy has the above line but it is not too accurate. However, should any of you wish to establish a D.A.R. claim, it may be used to trace the Stone line. I have not ever been interested but there is no doubt of eligibility.

Dear Dad,

I went to the New England Historic Society library today, got a membership for \$25 and spent the whole day there. I found the genealogies of Simon and Gregory Stone by J. Gardner Bartlett - each of them is a massive 500 page book. I found there:

Martha Dudley Stone, b. 1839 Dec 26; m. at Sudbury Mass 1859 June 23
Wyman S. Tasker of Marlborough, Mass., b. in Cabot Vt about 1833
son of John and Frances (-----) Tasker. He was a carpenter and later they settled in Somerville, Mass.

I also found a Waldo E. Stone, who should be the same one I wrote to. He is your third cousin once removed.

The Stone genealogy goes back to Walter Atte Stone in England, 24 generations removed from me, who was alive in 1314 (about). One of the Stones died on the Lusitania. Gregory Stone and his son had a 35 acre lot in Cambridge, very near to Harvard University, in the 1600's. It's possible that the "Stone elm" is still alive, and I know exactly where to look for it. John Stone, 1757-1844 served in the Revolutionary War, and was a minuteman: "marched to Concord and Cambridge on the Lexington alarm, April 19, 1775: service 4 days." I can get you precise info if anyone wants to join the DAR.

I searched Tennessee histories partially, and found some Grayson's. It probably duplicates what you have already, but I'm sending it anyway so you can determine that.
