

JOHN TASKER, the father of WYMAN TASKER

JOHN TASKER, born about 1790, place not known, enlisted from the town of JOHNSON, VERMONT, on the 17th of September 1813 in the company of militia commanded by Captain THOMAS WATERMAN, in the regiment commanded by Col. Luther Dixon. They marched from Johnson about the 24th of Sept. 1813 to Cumberland, N.Y., near Plattsburgh. John Tasker was detached from the company with a number of other soldiers to act as a Provision Guard while the remainder of the company marched to Champlain with Dixon's regiment. John Tasker was honorably discharged after about 2½ months service on November 30th, 1813.

John TASKER, made a declaration for bounty land for his war services on August 13 1855. He stated he was 65 years old, a resident of NEWBURY, VERMONT, and that he had been a private in Capt. Waterman's company. He signed his own application which was witnessed by Wm. H. Clogston and J.S. Eastman of West Fairlee, Vermont, and notarized by Abram Beau, J.P. of Orange county, Vt., Aug. 17, 1855. John Tasker made another declaration for his bounty land at age 67, a resident of Newbury, Vermont, on October 30, 1856, ~~in Lamont, County, Vt.~~ This declaration was notarized Nov. 30, 1856. Newbury is in ORANGE Co., Vt.

JOHN TASKER's muster rolls show that Waterman's company rendezvoused at Burlington Sept. 25, 1813, that John Tasker was enlisted for 30 (three) months, that he actually served 1 month and 23 days, that the expiration of his service was Nov. 17, 1813, that his pay was at the rate of \$8.00 per month, that he was paid 14 dollars and 13 cents.

Apparently John Tasker received 160 acres of bounty land on May 1st 1857. Ref.: National Archives Records.

John Tasker also volunteered to go to Plattsburg, Sept. 1814 and served 3 days in Capt. Anthony Perry's company. Ref: bk 52, AGA pp. 252-3.

JOHN TASKER married FANNY CLARK August 20th, 1815, at Walden, Vermont. Ref.: Vital Statistics, State Library, Montpelier, Vt.

JOHN TASKER is head of a family in 1830 in the U.S. Federal Census at CABOT, Vermont, but is not found in Cabot in 1840 or in 1850. Listed were Males: 1 under 5; 2 ~~under~~ 5-10; 2 10-15; 1 40-50; Females: 1 5-10; 1 30-40. This is interpreted to mean that John and Fanny Tasker had 6 living children in 1830, 15 years after they married: 5 boys and 1 girl, and that at least 1 other child (Wyman) was born after the census. (WYMAN TASKER b. 10 Aug. 1834 in Cabot, VT.; d. 29 April 1900.)

You have been extremely kind and helpful; I hope I may impose on you again about the Taskers. I have some new clues.

My John Tasker was drafted from Johnson, Vt., in 1813, with a Silas Tasker, relationship unknown. I have been checking material on Silas, therefore, since John and Silas probably share common antecedents.

SILAS TASKER married SUSAN COLLINS.

Their first child, AMANDA TASKER, was born in Berkshire, Vt., in 1811.

Their last child, Daniel TASKER, was born in Woodbury, Vt., 5 miles from Cabot, Vt., in May, 1821. In July, 1822 in Cabot, Vt., JOHN TASKER bought 50 acres of land.

Therefore the questions:

1. Are there Taskers in Berkshire & Woodbury in 1790, 1800, 1810, and 1820?
2. Are there Histories of those 2 towns with Tasker names?
3. Is there a Collins Genealogy that mentions Tasker?

In regard to the genealogy: I am happily tracing the Taskers: did I send you much of this? Wyman's father was John Tasker who married Fanny Clark. Their children were William Goodman Tasker, James, Rodofus, John Jefferson, Wyman, Henry, Sarah, Elizabeth, Drusella, and Henry.

John Tasker came from Northwood, N.H. I believe him to be the same John Tasker of Barnstead, N.H., born May 4, 1789, to Joseph Tasker and his wife Mary (Pickering). Joseph was born 1755, died 1833, was a soldier of the Revolution. (We could establish another DAR line if I can prove this.) Joseph and Sarah had Polly, Betsey, Lois, William, Abigail, John, Joseph, Mehitable, Paul, and Ira.

Joseph's father was a John Tasker, the first settler of Barnstead. John was born 1718, married Mary Young; he died 1797. They had children: Abigail, Joseph, Mary, Nathaniel, and Lois.

John Tasker above was actually John, jr. His father was John Tasker, sr., born about 1680, who married Judith Davis in 1718 and had 8 children: Ebenezer, John, William, Elizabeth, Rebecca, James, _____, _____.

John Tasker, sr., was the son of the immigrant to America. He was William Tasker, born in England about 1655, who settled in Madbury, N.H. He married Sarah Adams, d. of the first Charles Adams. William killed an Indian in one story. He died 1697. William and Sarah had 3 children. Samuel was slain by Indians in 1704. Mary married S. Perkins. John Tasker, sr. was the 3rd child.

I have reamed of Tasker material if you are interested. I hope I can prove that our John Tasker was the son of Joseph Tasker. Perhaps Joseph's war record will prove it.

Dear Ms. Sargent,

Your letters have been very helpful in the past in providing information about my Tasker ancestors and I wish to thank you.

You mentioned that you have records on deaths and burials but had none for John or Fanny. I now have some new clues and dates and perhaps you can help with your records.

My basic research problem is to find the father of John Tasker born about 1790. John was drafted from Johnson, Vt. in 1813, lived in Cabot, Vt. in 1830.

If Ruth Tasker who was married in Cabot in 1817 was John's sister, an estate of Ruth, or other information might tell where they were born.

Silas Tasker who was drafted at the same time in 1813 in Johnson was recorded as born in New Hampshire in the 1850 census in Beloit, Wisc. Silas was probably a brother to John. John was probably born in N.H. where there were 11 heads of families named Tasker in the 1790 census. John was born about 1790 according to his war records.

Mathew F. Peabody of Orange county, Vt. (Newbury?) was son-in-law to my John Tasker in his military bounty records. Do you have anything on Mrs. Peabody, daughter of John Tasker? They were in Orange co. in 1863.

Adolphus Tasker of Cabot in the 1850 census was probably a son of my John Tasker. Do you have any death or biography on him or on his son Charles Tasker born in Cabot in 1842?

John Tasker lived in Newbury, Vt. in 1855. He lived in Grafton county, N.H. in 1863. There are no later records of John Tasker. He lived therefore at least to the age of about 73. Note that Grafton co, ~~Vt~~ N.H. is across the river from Orange co., Vt.

Can you help? I will pay any fee.

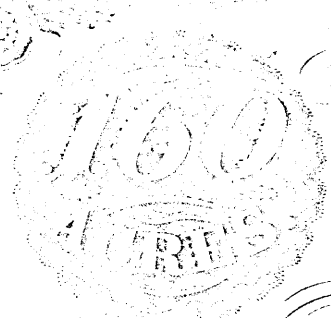

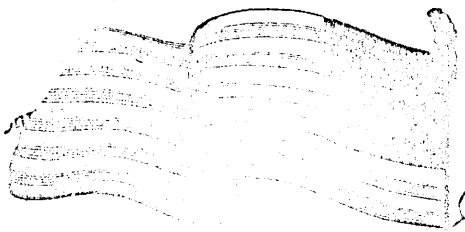

The 1850 census of Cabot shows only Adolphus 25, Mariah 28 and Charles 8, all born in Vermont. I couldn't find a Tasker family there in 1840 but the ink is poor and there are scratches in the film so there could have been one and I missed it. The 1830 gives - John Tasker with -
